VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

For the upcoming 2025 campaigns we are looking for volunteers to assist in various areas of the campaign. No experience needed just willing to donate some time for a great cause.

Areas that we will be needing assistance are as follows:

- Drop off poppies and poster entries to the schools in the north end of the city and then pick up after November 11. We can split this into several areas so it would only take a few hours of your time.
- Help get the supplies ready for the schools and other locations before the campaign begins.
- Help with organizing the local cadets supplies and pick up and drop off on the 2 weekends
- Help with dropping off and picking up poppies at local stores, community venues or factories in the North end
- We have 3 routes where we drop off the boxes with poppies at the various venues at the start of the campaign. Depending on the location and consumer traffic visit then over the next 2 weeks check to make sure the full boxes are replaced or topped up. Extra help here is always appreciated
- We have 3 displays Walmart, Zehr's King George Road and Zehr's on Fairview/ West Street having volunteers at the booth during the drive is very important and creates an awareness of the reason for Remembrance Day and how this event supports our veterans. Students can get their volunteer hours this way if you can supervise their shift. We will post a sign up sheet for the displays at the legion in October

CHICK WRIGHT GOLF TOURNAMENT


